To Whom It May Concern,

Re: Access to Information Request concerning CRTC staff letter of 7 March 2018 to SCFP with respect to its Part 1 Application asking the CRTC to re-examine the CRTC's Digital Media Exemption Order

On 13 February 2018 the Conseil provincial BDU regulations secteur des communications du Syndicat canadien de la fonction publique (SCFP) submitted a Part 1 application to the CRTC asking it to re-examine the CRTC's Digital Media Exemption Order. On 7 March 2018 the CRTC's Executive Director of Broadcasting wrote SCFP to say that "[i]l ne semble donc pas approprié pour le Conseil d'initier une instance publique distincte pour considerer votre demande."

Pursuant to sections 4(1) and 6 of Canada's *Access to Information Act*, R.S., 1985, c. a-1, I am asking for records related to the above-quoted statement from the 7 March 2018 staff letter, which are held by the CRTC, by members of the CRTC, or by the CRTC's staff, and which include but are not limited to: research, analysis, briefing notes, e-mails, text messages, correspondence, records memorializing telephone conversations and/or minutes of meetings.

I do not require a copy of materials that are already on the CRTC's public record (such as those submitted by SCFP to the CRTC regarding the Part 1 Application, or materials submitted by applicants or interveners in either the 'FairPlay' or the 2017-359 proceedings).
